Background

The History of Stained Glass

Evidence of stained glass dates back to the Ancient Roman Empire, when craftsman began using colored glass to produce decorative wares. While few fully intact stained glass pieces from this period exist, the Lycurgus Cup indicates that this practice emerged as early as the 4th century.



Materials

glass, pencil, eraser, scratch paper,
paint brush, acrylic paints, water cup,
paper plate, paper towel

Instructions

- Decide upon your design. Keep it SIMPLE. You can use your phone for reference. Sketch it out first.
- Dab the paint on a couple of times or add a couple of coats.
- Water thins the paint and helps it move better, but don't overdo it.
- If you make a mistake, wipe it off with the paper towel while it's still wet.
- Clean your brush between colors. Change your water when it gets cloudy.
- Mix colors using the color wheel.
- Prizes!!
