Board Policy 5142 Student Safety***

STUDENTS

SUBJECT: Student Safety

The County Board of Education (County Board) and County Superintendent of Schools or designee (County Superintendent) recognize the importance of providing a safe school environment that is conducive to learning and helps ensure student safety and the prevention of student injury. The County Superintendent shall implement appropriate practices to minimize the risk of harm to students, including, but not limited to, practices relative to school facilities and equipment, the outdoor environment, educational programs, and school-sponsored activities.

Additionally, the County Superintendent shall regularly review current guidance regarding cybersecurity and digital media awareness and incorporate recommended practices into the County Office of Education (County Office) processes and procedures related to the protection of the County Office's network infrastructure, and the monitoring and response to suspicious and/or threatening digital media content.

It shall be the responsibility of the site administrator to schedule and assign school employees to provide adequate pupil supervision. A record of such schedules shall be kept by the site administrator.

Site administrators, teachers, and other staff shall be responsible for the conduct and safety of students during school hours and school-sponsored activities and while students are using County Office of Education transportation to and from school.

The site administrator or designee shall establish school rules consistent with law, County Office policy and regulation for the safe and appropriate use of school equipment, materials, and for student conduct. School staff shall train students on the safety rules and shall provide instruction

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on safety and emergency procedures, as well as injury and disease prevention as appropriate. Copies of the rules shall be sent to parents/guardians and be readily available at the school at all times.

Reporting Threats

Any certificated or classified employee, or other school official, whose duties bring the employee or other school official in contact on a regular basis with students in any of grades 6-12, as part of a middle or high school, who are alerted to or observe any threat or perceived threat of a homicidal act, as defined, shall immediately report the threat or perceived threat to law enforcement in accordance with Education Code 49393. (Education Code 49390, 49393)

Threat or perceived threat means any writing or action of a student that creates a reasonable suspicion that the student is preparing to commit a homicidal act related to school or a school activity. This may include possession, use, or depictions of firearms, ammunition, shootings, or targets in association with infliction of physical harm, destruction, or death in a social media post, journal, class note, or other media associated with the student. It may also include a warning by a parent, student, or other individual.

Additionally, anyone who receives or learns of a health or safety threat related to school or a school activity is expected to report the threat to a school or County Office administrator immediately.

Student Identification Cards and Safety Information

Student identification cards of students in grades 7-12 shall have printed on them safety information, including the following: (Education Code 215.5)

1. The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline telephone number and, at the County Office's discretion, the Crisis Text Line and/or a local suicide prevention hotline telephone number
2. The National Domestic Violence Hotline
