The academic events are designed to support, encourage, recognize, and promote student learning.

Each of our academic events support teachers through program models supporting California state teaching standards and recognize outstanding student and/or team performances in subjects ranging from art and performance to math and science.

The Riverside County Office of Education student academic events are open for participation by any public school, school district, charter school, private, or parochial school located within the county of Riverside. Independent home-schooled students may participate through the public school the student would normally attend, with approval of the school.

RIVERSIDE COUNTY ACADEMIC DECATHLON



Academic Decathlon is an academic competition for students in grades 9 through 12. Students compete as team members in a series of academic tests and demonstrations. Each team consists of three “A” (Honor), three “B” (Scholastic), and three “C” or below (Varsity) students. Awards are presented to the top teams as well as the top individual students in each event.

Academic Decathlon is, like its ancient Greek counterpart, a 10-event contest. Participants demonstrate their academic strength by completing seven objective tests, writing an essay, delivering a prepared and an impromptu speech, and participating in an interview. The exciting Super Quiz is a team event held before a live audience.

Within Riverside County, the champion of the county event advances to the California Academic Decathlon. The California Academic Decathlon winner advances to the United States Academic Decathlon competition.

Registration fee: \$675 per team*

Teams must also provide a minimum number of judges or be subject to a surcharge.

RIVERSIDE COUNTY MOCK TRIAL



The Mock Trial competition is designed for students in grades 9 through 12. Mock Trial simulates a criminal trial, with students trying the case as members of the defense and prosecution teams. Through performance-based education, the program furthers an understanding of both the content and processes of our legal system; increases basic skills, analytical ability and self-confidence; and promotes cooperation among students of various cultures and interests.

Within Riverside County, the champion of the county event advances to the California Mock Trial Finals. The California Mock Trial winner advances to the National High School Mock Trial Championship.

Registration fee: \$750 per team*

**Participation is limited to one team per high school.*

(A wild card second team may be selected if odd number of teams participating.)

RIVERSIDE COUNTY SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING FAIR



The Science and Engineering Fair is a competition of science and engineering projects designed, developed, and displayed by students in grades 4 through 12.



Participants share their creative abilities, knowledge, and interests with other students. Experienced judges critique the projects for qualities including scientific method, content, clarity of presentation, and originality. The Riverside County Science and Engineering Fair is affiliated with the International Science and Engineering Fair (ISEF).



Within Riverside County, the competition begins at the school level, with winners advancing to an affiliate fair competition, then to the county level. Riverside County winners advance to the California State Science and Engineering Fair. Select participants may also advance to the ISEF competition and the Thermo Fisher Scientific Junior Innovators Challenge competition.

RIVERSIDE COUNTY HISTORY DAY



National History Day (NHD) is a year-long educational program in which students in grades 4 through 12 become historians.

After selecting a historical topic that relates to an annual theme, students conduct extensive research by using libraries, archives, museums, and oral history interviews. They analyze and interpret their findings, draw conclusions about the significance of their topics in history, and create final projects to present their work. These projects can be used at the school site for rich project-based learning experiences and/or entered into a series of competitions from the local to the national level, where they are evaluated by professional historians and educators.

Within Riverside County, the competition begins at the school level, with winners advancing to a district competition, then to the county level. Riverside County winners advance to NHD-CA State Finals, and state winners then advance to the National HD Contest in Maryland.

Registration fee: \$50 per student*

Districts must also provide a designated number of judges based on the entries submitted, or be subject to a surcharge.

**Limit of three entries in each category at the district, charter school, private, or parochial school level.*

RIVERSIDE COUNTY REGIONAL SPELLING BEE



The Spelling Bee competition is for students in grades 4 through 8. The Bee helps students improve their spelling, increase their vocabularies, learn concepts, and develop correct English usage.

Students study the correct spelling of words from prepared study lists and participate in “round” competition in which contestants are eliminated as they misspell a word. Students prepare for the county Spelling Bee using materials provided by Scripps through required school enrollment.

Within Riverside County, the competition begins at the school level, with winners advancing to a district competition, then to the county level. The top speller in the county Bee advances to the Scripps National Spelling Bee.

Registration fee: \$250 per district*

**Limit of two participants, one winner and one alternate, from each district, charter school, private, or parochial school level.*
