

## Recommendations for the use of AI in Student Research:

Students have freedom to use Google, AI or any other resources, but they should ultimately refer to original scientific articles, and they should be able to defend their project.

Importantly, AI is not reliable for generating valid sources, so students need to be careful and validate the information that the AI is providing.

There is no practical way to “ban” the use of AI tools; in fact, using artificial intelligence and machine learning is an existing tool in student scientific research that is being widely used.

The SRC expectation is that students will not have used an AI-tool to provide information such as providing text for writing that is indicated as their own.

The expectation is students will cite the use of AI as they would other sources of materials used in the ideation and implementation of their project.
