

STUDENTS

Promotion/Acceleration/Retention

The County Board of Education and County Superintendent of Schools expect students to progress through each grade within one school year. To accomplish this, instruction should accommodate the varying interests and growth patterns of individual students and include strategies for addressing academic deficiencies when needed.

Students shall progress through the grade levels by demonstrating growth in learning and meeting grade-level standards of expected student achievement.

When high academic achievement is evident, the County Superintendent or designee may recommend a student for acceleration into a higher grade level. The student's social and emotional growth shall be taken into consideration in making a determination to accelerate a student.

As early as possible in the school year and in students' school careers, the County Superintendent or designee shall identify students who should be retained and who are at risk of being retained in accordance with law, County Office of Education policy, and administrative regulation. Methods used to measure progress of students enrolled in County Office of Education programs include: authentic assessments which include portfolios, products, performances, and presentations; criterion referenced testing; and standardized testing.

When a student is recommended for retention or is identified as being at risk for retention, the County Superintendent or designee shall provide opportunities for remedial instruction to assist the student in overcoming his/her academic deficiencies. Such opportunities may include but are not limited to tutorial programs, after-school programs, summer school programs and/or the establishment of a student study team.
